

Corn snake

Some corn snakes are yellow and have white spots. Some corn snakes are gray with black and white lanes.



Corn snakes are found in the eastern United States from southern New Jersey south through Florida, west into Louisiana and part of Kentucky.



Corn snakes do not usually feed every Day instead they feed every few days. Young hatchlings tend to feed on lizards and tree frogs, while adults feed on larger pray. such as mice, rats, birds, and bats.



The breeding season of corn snakes is from March to May. The snakes are omnivorous, depositing a clutch of 10 to 30 eggs late May to July.
