



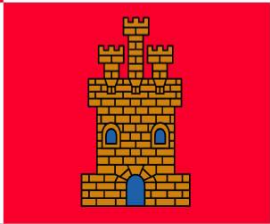
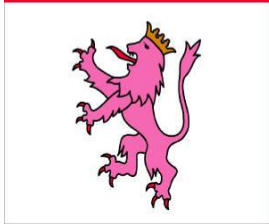
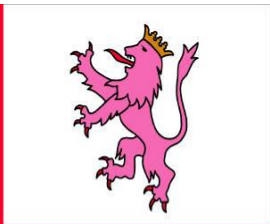
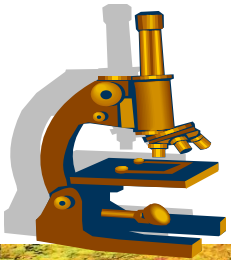
# Cockroaches
